

## DEPARTMENT 19 – ANTIQUES

### CLASS A - ANTIQUES

#### RULES:

1. No dealer entries will be accepted. Only amateurs, who collect as a hobby, are eligible to compete.
2. Antiques should not be less than 50 years old.
3. No items previously receiving an award at this fair will be accepted for competition.
4. Mounted exhibits must be on firm backing and able to be hung on pegboard hooks.
5. All items must include a 3" X 5" card, which tells the identity of article, age, place of origin and maker. You can also include other interesting information such as use, family history, etc.
6. Reproductions will be disqualified.
7. Every precaution will be taken to ensure safety of exhibits, but in no case will the management be responsible for loss or injury to it.
8. The superintendent has the privilege of rejecting any item not meeting requirements.

## CLASS B – GENEALOGY

### RULES:

1. Copies and reproductions are accepted on all paper items and photos and will be judged the same as any original.
2. Items previously receiving an award may NOT be entered again unless additional information has been added or entered in a different class.
3. A separate typewritten 5x7 index card giving a description of the item must accompany each item. Exhibitor must indicate the connection the item has to his/her family or ancestry and information about the exhibit.
4. Diligence will be used to insure the safety of articles after their arrival and placement, but in no case, will fair personnel or Douglas County Genealogy Club be held responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
5. Superintendents have the right to reclassify exhibits if necessary for proper placement in a particular class.

1. DAR, SAR, Mayflower documentation research
2. Genealogical certificates of any type
3. Display of end of life memorabilia (no larger than 24"x36")
4. Photo of building of ancestral significance (8"x 10" or smaller)
5. Ancestral photo including a direct line ancestor (8"x10" or smaller)
6. Any other photo of genealogical significance (8"x10" or smaller)
7. Display of ancestral photos (no larger than 24"x36")
8. Display of genealogical research (no larger than 24"x36")
9. Book (not scrapbooks) of genealogical significance
10. Display of genealogic charts
11. Pedigree photo chart (at least 4 generations and no larger than 24"x36")
12. Genealogy scrapbook
13. Biographical sketch of an ancestor (typed, double spaced, 12 pt font). May include photos
14. Genealogical video: up to 5 minutes in length. Must be present and able to play it at judging
15. Census records (State or Federal). Three or more from same individual
16. Any other genealogical exhibit
